Old MacDonald Had a Farm ALTERED VERSION

The adult starts the verse correctly but then gives the wrong sound for the animal mentioned. The child has to stop the adult and give the correct animal sound.

Old MacDonald had a farm, E-I-E-I-O, And on his farm he had some <u>chicks</u>, E-I-E-I-O. With a moo-moo here, and a moo-moo there, Here a moo, there a moo, ev'rywhere a moo-moo. Old MacDonald had a farm, E-I-E-I-O.

To make it a little harder, the adult can sing:

Old MacDonald had a farm, E-I-E-I-O, And on his farm he had a <u>cow</u>, E-I-E-I-O. With a <u>quack-quack</u> here, and a <u>honk-honk</u> there, Here a <u>cluck</u>, there a <u>neigh</u>, ev'rywhere an <u>oink-oink</u>. Old MacDonald had a farm, E-I-E-I-O.

The child has to wait till the end of the verse to correct the adult and give the correct animal sound. This requires the child to remember the animal originally mentioned. It is difficult for many young children (and some adults!) to do this.
